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Professor Barrie Bennett authored a book in 2017, entitled *Instructional Expertise: Conversations with Myself and Others*. The book was published by the by the State School Teacher Union Western Australia (SSTUWA). It aims to provide practical insights into the process of observing and having intentional conversations before, during and after a learning experience, with the focus on instruction. It is designed to facilitate the teacher as a reflective, analytical, and creative practitioner with the intention of selecting and integrating pedagogical approaches to maximise the diverse learning needs of students.

Barrie, and the SSTUWA have generously given ETBI and the Instructional Leadership Programmed the right to publish the book for the Irish educational context. In preparing for publication, we have decided to replace some of the graphics with photographs and sample student/teacher work from Irish classrooms.
