# 1. Learning Outcomes

- 1. Develop digital skills through use of Digital Graphic Organizers / Google Drawings.
- 2. To add information in a digital format.
- 3. To work collaboratively or individually to complete exercise while maintaining social distance.
- 4. To use digital technology to access, manage and share content.
- 5. To express ideas digitally.

#### 3. Resources required

Digital Device, Internet Access, Google Drawings and Google Classroom.

#### 4. Instructions for the teacher

- Create the template prior to the lesson.
  - Share Graphic Organiser through Google Classroom, make sure to click 'Make a Copy for each student' (this will make sure your original template will never be edited)
- Monitor groups while working on task
- Gather feedback from groups / individuals
- Allow students to edit their work to add information that they may have missed while correcting
- You can check all of the work completed through Classroom





### 5. The Rules to be shared with the students

- Go to Google Classroom and open the assigned task.
- Complete assigned work (in groups or individual)
- Do not click 'Hand in' until the work has been corrected in class.
- When other groups / individuals are providing answers, add in any pieces of information you are missing.
- Click 'Hand in' work
- Use your completed graphic organisers for revision, they will be in Google Drive and available through Google Classroom.
- 6. Examples of lesson tools in which this tactic could be used Teamwork, Understanding Risk, Flexibility/Adaptability etc.
  - Teamwork / Group work
  - Think, Pair, Share
  - Independent work
  - Across all subject areas
  - Introducing new concepts
  - Revision exercise
  - Student Collaboration
