We look forward to further progressing the actions in 2025.





**Total Clicks** - is how many times a user clicked through to your site.

**Total impressions** - is how many times a user saw a link to your site in search results.

**Average click-through rate (CTR)** - is the percentage of impressions that resulted in a click.


**Average position** - is the average position of your site in search results, based on its highest position whenever it appeared in a search.

Unique Visitor - is a term used which refers to a person who has visited the website at least once and is counted only once in the reporting time period

**Engagement Rate** – quantifies how actively users interact with your website content.

Difference between impressions and total views - "Impressions" typically represent the frequency with which your content is displayed on a user's screen. "Total Views" signify that the user interacted with the content.

#### Website and Social Media Analytics – IL X Analytic



**Impressions** - Impressions are the number of times a tweet has been seen by users on the social media platform.

**Profile Visits** - Profile visits refer to the number of times other users visit your account's profile page in the X app or its website over a certain period. These are users who clicked your profile to learn more about you.

**Engagements -** Total number of times a user interacted with a Tweet. Clicks anywhere on the Tweet, including Retweets, replies, follows, likes, links, cards, hashtags, embedded media, username, profile photo, or Tweet expansion.

Detail Expands - Times people viewed the details about this post

New Followers – Indicates the number of new followers

Mentions - is when an X user includes another user's handle in their tweet, using the '@' symbol followed by the username (e.g., @username).
